Dopo una panoramica sull'importanza della narrazione nella storia dell'uomo, sulle specificità della comunicazione cooperativa umana, sui bisogni comunicativi complessi e sugli elementi principali dell'intervento di Comunicazione Aumentativa e Alternativa (CAA), vengono approfonditi gli aspetti più pratici della costruzione e dell'uso degli INbook: scelta del libro e dell'argomento, modelli di riferimento e adattamenti per consentire un'adeguata fruibilità (struttura del testo e della frase, simboli, illustrazioni, formati, ecc.).

Asylum

Kristine Barnett's son Jacob has an IQ higher than Einstein's, a photographic memory, and he taught himself calculus in two weeks. At nine he started working on an original theory in astrophysics that experts believe may someday put him in line for a Nobel Prize, and at age twelve he became a paid researcher in quantum physics. WINNER The Strega Prize Gerda Taro was a German-Jewish war photographer, anti-fascist activist, artist and innovator who, together with her partner, the Hungarian Endre Friedmann, was one half of the alias Robert Capa, widely considered to be the twentieth century's greatest war and political photographer.
