The Outsiders

I've been influenced by the Dadaists and Op Art. With a taste for the absurd and a general interest in Jung's ideas about mandalas, for years now I've been playing

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around visually with words and symbols. In concrete poetry I began creating patterns with letters and words and then started taking photographs when I became conscious that the kind of shapes I was interested in creating already existed in various ways in my environment. On the first page in 'Could be" I explain "Since becoming a concrete poet, among other things, in the Sixties, I have been working mainly in black and white. In the Ninties I began working in colour sometimes reworking earlier pieces. Those in this collection are mainly in colour'. For some years now I have been creating artist's books as a way of bringing related works together so that the viewer can get a general sense of what I am doing, particularly in my photography. Just as I favour Jerzy Grotowski's preference for simple props in theatre, I like using readily available materials for concrete poetry and other visual art work, including photography. After originally using a typewriter and Leterset transfer letters for concrete poetry I now use a computer. For my photography I use a 'tourist' camera. For prints, I use generally available photo labs (such as Ted's in Melbourne) and Snapfish for printing my artist's books, simply ordering in the same way as one would order a photobook via their templates, without any special provisions - converting any files that aren't photographs to JPEGs so they can work in this medium' --Artist statement.

The Last Vispo Anthology

Poetry. MENDELEEV'S MANDALA begins in pilgrimage and ends in pilgrimage, but nowhere in-between does it find a home. Logic is the lodestar, as these poems struggle to make sense out of chaos. Jessica Goodfellow reimagines stories from the Old Testament, Greek mythology, and family history by invoking muses as diverse as Wittgenstein, Newton, the Wright Brothers, and an ancient Japanese

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monk. In the title poem, Mendeleev's periodic table, sparked by fire and by trains, sees the elements of the world come into focus as a geometric pattern that recalls the ancient mandalas, also blueprints of an expanding universe as a whole. Throughout this book, Goodfellow uses and misuses mathematics, cosmology, biology, and etymology to push the boundaries of poetic form in a manner that mimics how time and tragedy push the human form to its limits. An examination of the history of clocks reveals that the human body is the ultimate clock. Aging, physical deterioration, and the disintegration of relationships are experienced as a ratio of what can and what can't be seen- the slow calamity of vision loss, both literal and metaphorical. Yet, despite the gravity of their themes, these poems are often heartbreakingly funny. Vacillating wildly between the consultation of gurus, monks, and fortunes tellers, and the chasing of reason as redemption in the face of impermanence, this book is equal parts wander and wonder. Welcome to the pilgrimage. "This book is a library whittled down to a message in a bottle. When she was a toddler, Jessica Goodfellow's twenty-two-year-old uncle, along with six other climbers from the 1967 Wilcox Expedition to Denali, was lost in an unprecedented ten-day storm blasting winds of up to three-hundred miles per hour. Just as North America's highest peak is so massive that it has its own distinct

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weather system—changeable and perilous, subject to sudden whiteout conditions—a family whose loved one is irretrievably lost has a grief so blinding and vast that it also creates its own capricious internal weather, one that lasts for generations. Whiteout is Goodfellow's account of growing up in this unnavigable and often unspoken-of climate of bereavement. Although her poems begin with a missing body, they are not an elegy. Instead, Goodfellow struggles with the absence of cultural ritual for the uncontainable loss of a beloved one whose body is never recovered and whose final story is unknowable. There is no solace here, no possible reconciliation. Instead, Whiteout is a defiant gaze into a storm that engulfs both the wildness of Alaska and of familial mourning.
